Monte Vista On-Line Academy is not a traditional program but is a public school requiring continuous and active student participation and attendance. CDE mandates that online students comply with the compulsory attendance law, which in the online environment translates to not only frequent logins but also making regular progress towards their assigned work.

MVOLA establishes the minimum progress for students on the Student Academic Plan (SAP) and Performance Contract (signed by students and parents upon enrollment). This progress requires students to pass a minimum of two out of four core classes (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies). Students who are *not* engaging in the curriculum as demonstrated through consistent Moodle log-ins, assessment completion, online submissions, time on-task, and teacher communication **will** be placed on Academic Probation.

You are receiving this letter of academic probation because \_\_\_\_\_ has not demonstrated engagement with the curriculum and is currently failing more than **two core classes** during the 1st quarter. If this pattern continues, re-enrollment with OLA next semester will not be an option.

MVOLA cares about our students and strives to ensure that our online learning program is an appropriate fit. Working in an online environment requires a partnership between the families and school. Please contact me to create a plan to ensure your student's success and continued enrollment in our program.

Your student's long term success is important to us. If this Academic Probation Status is not resolved, we will provide guidance in finding an educational option that will be more successful.
